.... Are we heading in the right direction?

Introduction — For countless years Australia has been reliant on the significant support of allies to bolster our protection against possible invasion. We clung to assurances of British protection until the Japanese invasion of Singapore in 1942, then to the United States, our hopedfor protector under the ANZUS Treaty.

The Morrison government, followed closely by that of Albanese, doubled down in their faith of US protection under the AUKUS agreement. But given that the mantle of US world domination is slipping, is such confidence justified? Is the acquisition of a handful of nuclear-powered submarines and other mobile equipment a wise defence measure against a resurgent China?

Richard Broinowski was schooled in Melbourne and Adelaide. He obtained his Bachelor of Laws degree at Adelaide University in 1961 and was admitted to the Bar in Adelaide in 1963. He later earned a Master's Degree in Public Administration from the John F. Kennedy School at Harvard (1978). Richard lives with his wife, Dr Alison Broinowski, another former diplomat, in Paddington.

His Presentation Richard will be describing the way our options in a fast-changing regional world have been restricted by the Morrison and Albanese governments, how our sovereignty has been compromised by a too-close engagement with the United States military and how we could be drawn into a war with China over Taiwan. He will also touch on the usefulness, or otherwise, of purchasing up to eight nuclear propelled submarines from the United States. In addition, he will explore our contradictory relationship with China – how on the one hand we

flatter them with well-meaning assurances, and on the other, busily prepare for war against them.
