



Dangar Island Cruise

Wednesday 24th September

Before it received its current name, this little island just off the mainland held thousands of years of indigenous storylines. Following white settlement, Dangar Island played an important role in the discovery of much needed farmlands for the newly colonised Sydney. Governor Phillip used the Island as a base for his explorations of the Hawkesbury River, resulting in the farming settlements of Windsor and Richmond. Later, the Island housed the construction workers for the Railway Bridge, completed in 1889.

Enjoy a guided walking tour of this historic island (or a cruise around it for those who don't wish to walk). The walk is approximately 1km, taken at a relaxed pace, and is tailored to suit mature travellers and seniors.

After the tour, enjoy our Postie-Ploughman's lunch on board the boat.

Our 3 hour cruise departs from Brooklyn and includes morning tea and a delicious ploughman's lunch of shaved ham, tasty cheese, tomato, zucchini, carrot, mixed lettuce, pickled onions, dinner rolls, pickles and fruit chutney with tea or coffee to follow.

Upon returning to Brooklyn we will commence our return journey on the old highway through Cowan, Berowra, Mt Kur-ing-gai, Mt Colah and Asquith.
