October GUEST SPEAKER

John Williams "I was a Barnado's Boy"



For most of us, childhood was the easiest part of our lives, but for thousands of Australian children it can be the hardest.

In 1870, Dr Thomas Barnardo opened his first home for boys in Stepney Causeway. He regularly went out at night into the slum district to find destitute boys. In 1921, the first Barnado home was established in Australia to house British child immigrants.

In 1936, John was born in England into a disadvantaged family. He lived in an orphanage from the age of 5 to 12. Then arriving in Sydney he was sent to Barnardo House in Ashfield and then to a Barnardo home in Picton. This establishment was a training property for future farmers. [I will let John tell his own story.]

John married Elaine in 1966 = they have two sons and five grandchildren. He will talk on his life from birth to now, including his experiences as a Barnardo's Boy.
