"Nuclear Power - Australia's Answer to Climate Change?"

Nuclear power generation has served the international community well and with remarkable safety for over 60 years. Today it is part of the portfolio of over 30 countries and growing with over 440 civilian power reactors in service worldwide. It provides about 10% of the world's electricity. Over 50 new reactors are under construction, with over 400 more planned or proposed. Despite



having nearly 30% of the world's easily won low cost uranium resources, nuclear power is not part of Australia's generation portfolio and remains illegal. Should this be so? The Australian nuclear debate is far from over – indeed it is really only just beginning.

Martin Thomas served on Prime Minister Howard's Uranium Mining, Processing and Nuclear Energy Review. He was Head of the Cooperative Research Centre for Renewable Energy and a founding member of the Warren Centre Energy Committee at Sydney University. He has been President of Engineers Australia, President of the Australian Institute of Energy and Vice president of the Australian Academy of Technology and Engineering. His AM was awarded for services to energy and engineering.

His Presentation will consider

- The findings of Howard's Uranium Mining, Processing and Nuclear Energy Review taskforce.
- Issues of cost, sustainability, the alternatives, safety and spent fuel disposal.
- What are the current thoughts of politicians? {Note following the change of Federal Government in 2007 and its re-election in 2010, policies surrounding uranium and nuclear power generation in Australia have remained on hold)
- Should nuclear power be part of Australia's 2050 clean energy commitments?"
