#### **Ageism - The Next Frontier**

**Kathryn Greiner AO** – an Australian Politician and Social Advocate, is a remarkable Achiever and Contributor to our Society, well known to us all. Among her many involvements and directorships, in September 2012 Kathryn Greiner was appointed Chair of the Ministerial Advisory Committee on Ageing. She has devoted herself to improving the lot of Australia's aged population, hence the topic of her presentation today.

Kathryn says that it generally takes half a generation to shift the dial of change in the community's thinking. Think sexism, think racism and now ageism. It's the next hurdle to overcome to be a truly inclusive society. So, she has drawn on her vast experience in public policy-making and review positions to describe the impact of ageing on Australian society. She has many creative thoughts about improving both the lives of older Australians and society.
